Clean by Noon—or Else!

Boulder ordinances require sidewalks be kept clear, including clear of snow. If your walk is not cleaned off by noon after a snowfall you can be subject not only to the anger of your neighbors, but also to legal actions; first a warning, then a fine. It's going to be a lot less hassle, and more neighborly, to just shovel your walk promptly.

If you have a neighbor persistently failing to clear their walk after a snow, or who blocks the walk with trash cans, recycle bins or strangely parked automobiles, you can report them to the city either by calling the Environmental Enforcement Office at 303/441-3239 or by e-mailing Terry Steinborn at steinbornt@ci.bourdet.co.us.

Remember to include in your winter travel plans arrangements to get your walk shoveled while you are gone. You are obliged to keep a clear walk, whether you are home or not.



Ice Busters Needed With

The city matches these residents with volunteers who can spend a few minutes after each snowfall to help keep sidewalks safe for pedestrians. That's right-the Boulder Police Department is actively seeking citizens who would like to help in the newly-established Community Police Center (CPC) at the Pearl Street Mall annex. The CPC continues its efforts to decentralize police services, provide better access and convenience for residents, and enhance positive collaboration with the community.

Volunteers in the CPC serve as Community Support Specialists by conducting telephone and walk-in reception, referring citizens to appropriate city/county agencies, fingerprinting people for various licensing requirements, and performing other services. They ask for a commitment of one 4-hour shift per week (11 AM - 3 PM or 3 PM - 7 PM). 
