YMCA LEASES HIGH MAR POOL

The Boulder Valley YMCA recently signed a five year lease with City of Boulder on the High Mar pool, assuring the pool will be open in the summer for at least that time. They have been operating the pool for the last two years, but the length of this lease will enable the "Y" to invest in improvements, and \$20,000 has been budgeted for upgrading the facility this year, with most of the funds going to resurfacing the tennis courts and the decking around the pool.

The land is owned by the Boulder Housing Authority, and is still earmarked for "affordable housing" in the long term. A MANA committee is investigating ways to keep the pool open permanently, including purchase and exchange of the land with a Parks and Rec. parcel. GRANT MONEY AVAILABLE



NIST BUILDING TRAFFIC STUDY

Chris Holloway has been participating in a study of how the new NIST building might effect traffic in Martin Acres. The building was designed with 300 fewer parking piaces than employees, nevertheless, study determined that at least that many of the employees already commute by bicycle or bus, so the neighborhood is unlikely to turn into an overflow parking lot.

The building will host many more conferences and workshops than the old one, so out of town visiters arriving after the morning commute and not finding a place to park in the lots (which are designed to be full) might go looking through the neighborhood.
