TURNPIKE NOISE

Despite a lot of publicity and repeated com-

plaints, it appears that the Colorado Department of Transportation is unwilling to lower the speed limit on US 36 where it is adiacent to our neighborhood back down to 55 mph in order to reduce noise. The noise from the turnpike has been an issue in the neighborhood for as long as there has been a neighborhood here, according to long time residents. Despite considerable effort through the years and even a grant-funded noise mitigation feasibility study, nothing concrete has ever been accomplished.

MANA and representatives of Frasier Meadows (across the turnpike) have scheduled a meeting with CDOT to talk over the issue. Little is expected from the meeting, but we do want to keep reminding the DOT that the issue is alive. Please take every opportunity you see for applying whatever pressure you can; letter to state officials works well



TABLE MESA UPGRADE

At the last MANA meeting Randall Rutsch from GOBoulder reported on plans for upgrading Table Mesa Drive next year. Though the public input portion of the planning phase is just now getting underway (that input could cause the plan to change), as of right now, the project is pretty well defined. First, the roadway will be completely reconstructed. Structural defects preclude a simple overlay of asphalt; the City is considering concrete for a surface. Second, on-street bike lanes will be added. The stretch of Table Mesa bordering Martin Acres is the only section from Louisville to Lehigh Rd. lacking bike lanes; Boulder's commitment to balanced transportation almost dictates their placement, though there will be discussion whether bike lanes or a center turn lane is a wiser use of the right-of-way.

There will almost certainly be some discussion about buying up houses to widen the right of way, and it is equally certain that discussion will result in the decision not to. That option is enormously expensive and has been investigated and rejected before.

The final part of the plan includes rebuilding all of the sidewalks, and adding access ramps at the intersections. Rebuilding the sidewalks is necessary, both because of their poor state, and because the room for the bike lanes (or the center turn-iane) will be gained by eilminading the little planting strip adjacent to the current roadbed (which most of us feel would constitute a legitimate beautification project just by itself).

Public input on the plan will be solicited in meetings planned for this fall. The dates and locations for the meetings have not been published yet, but we will try to broadcast them as soon as we know about them, in the VOICE, on the MANA website and the Email list. You can also contact the GO Boulder office (or their website) for information and meeting dates.

THE MARTIN PRAIRIE

The concept was so wonderfully elegant; the little triangle of land south of Martin Park Elementary and East of Bear Creek was going to be torn up anyway during the flood control work along Bear Creek, so, why not contour it a little, plant native grasses (which could later be augmented with grassland wildflowers) and create a self-sustaining little "pocket prairie"? Such a little area could be an educational resource for the school (after all, the land is owned by BVSD), would require very little maintenance, and would be an attractive addition to the neighborhood. And all of this at little cost.

It turned out to be anything but elegant; to most eyes, it is nothing but a botched shot. The first seeding this spring failed, and the grass mix selected by the contractor for the second try had to be augmented (by a neighborhood plant ecologist, at her own expense) with three native species in order to reflect local realities. The seeding was apparently never irrigated, there have been no visible attempts at weed control, and the contractor even drove vehicles over the area after seeding, leaving a swath that still is completely bare. The vigorously growing grass on the north and west is redtop, an aggressive exotic which probably was introduced to the site with the fill from the creek bed. This weed will probably soon colonize most of the site, from where it will propagate throughout the adjacent areas.

The School District, the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District, and of ecures the contractor, all secon satisfied with the project. From the point of view of the residents, though, what we have been handed is, instead of a pleasant little prairie park, an eye sore and a new source of weeds for our yards.
