# MANA YEAR-END SUMMARIES

#### PRESIDENT REPORT BY MARK STANGL

Martin Acres is under going changes. We're seeing some homes fixed up or completely rebuilt. Some long term residents with growing families are leaving for larger homes out *East*—they will be missed. CU parents are investing in MA creating even more rentals especially near CU, along Moorhead, Table Mesa, and Lashley. Some long-term landlords are selling out in Martin Acres due problem tenants and regulations. For many of us there is still a strong commitment to the "neighborhood" and the simple pleasure of interacting in a positive way with each other. Due to budget restraints, City services are being cut and some things we have taken for granted must now be supplied by volunteers [e.g. BCIA sponsored cleanups]. MANA email server has created a new community in MA; items and ideas are given away and concerns are shared.

**MANA Community Participation:** Parade of Lights, Halloween Party, Home Tour, Pancake Breakfast, Eggstravaganza, and BCIA Cleanup on Broadway and US 36.

City Meetings and Ongoing Issues: Zoning Changes have been proposed that do not strongly affect MA. Interest remains high for a pedestrian crossing at 27th & Elm bikeway and 27th Way. Over occupancy laws continue to be of interest — difficult to enforce. Popups and scrapeoffs code changes under consideration by City of Boulder. High Mar Pool saga continues, but no leader has come forward to organize its rebirth. MANA is participating in the CU Alcohol Oversight Subcommittee and several other city committees and boards.

**Problems:** Parties along Moorhead and in Courts continue to negatively affect neighbors. Parks and Recs policy limiting our access to Martin Park to unload and load equipment for the Pancake Breakfast. Pet waste in Martin Park is still an issue for some nearby residents and park users. From the email list: Occupancy and Code enforcement do not seem to be uniformly applied.

**Police:** BPD sponsored a laptop computer registration due to rash of thefts around campus and neighborhoods. BPD has sent an officer to most of our monthly meetings and interested in helping prevent crimes.

#### VICE PRESIDENT RECAP BY STEVE CLASON

MANA continued the normal practice of heavy engagement with city officials in matters pertaining to our neighborhood. MANA was represented at:

- —the task force that recommended changes to Boulder's noise ordinances:
- —public hearings at Planning Board and Human Relations Council and community forums addressing changes to the definition of "Family" and how changing that definition could effect occupancy and density issues;
- —City Council Committee for CU/City and environmental enforcement issues;
- —City Council Subcommittee addressing changes to policies and regulations to reduce the negative effects of alcohol; —Planning Department Code Simplification Project. In general, our efforts have been to ensure that the effects of proposals on our neighborhood (and neighborhoods like ours) are considered when evaluating proposals and in that regard we have continued the successes of the past.

TREASURER BENNETT SCHARF REPORTS: After a successful 2003-4 (funded primarily by a very successful Pancake Breakfast) revenues have been about equal to expenditures in 2004-5. The VOICE ad revenue has almost paid the bills. Here is the total available funds for the last 3 fiscal years: 03/03: \$1,068.00 - 03/04: \$2,345.00 - 03/05: \$2,217.00

#### WELCOME COMMITTEE BY ALLISON O'NEALL

The welcome packets continue to be distributed, about 4-5 a month. The *Daily Camera* is the main source for locating new neighbors. Unfortunately, often these houses sit vacant because they have been bought as rental properties and are not yet rented when delivery is attempted. Thank you to Mary Huron, City Neighborhood Liaison for making copies. Local maps, pamphlets, etc. are collected from the city and other important organizations for inclusion in the packets.
