Renters & Homeowners alike!

We're glad you're here, hope to run into you at a n'hood gathering and would love to have you get involved in MANA. As we near the start of school, it's timely to remind ourselves to watch out for the young pedestrians and other neighborly things we may have forgotten (or not known about) that help to keep the peace in the neighborhood.

A Guide to Being Neighborly in Martin Acres

PARTIES: We like parties, too! Make sure your neighbors are aware of your plans. It is neighborly to invite them to call you if any concerns arise. Caution: city of Boulder issues costly tickets.

NOISE: Unreasonable noise that disrupts another person in their home causes problems...pets, stereo/TV, parties/gatherings, cars, fireworks.

PETS: Unattended pets and barking dogs are not only annoying but violate city ordinances. Please clean up after your pets on other's property and remember the city leash law.

PARKING AND DRIVING: It is illegal to park on the sidewalk, the wrong direction, and within 5 feet of any driveway. Cars parked halfway into driveways block the sidewalk, impeding pedestrian traffic...this is also a city violation and you'll get ticketed.

SNOW REMOVAL: All snow and ice must be cleared from the full width of a public sidewalk next to home property by noon on the day following a snowfall. The owner and occupant are jointly responsible for this removal (even when out of town).

WEEDS AND TRASH: Weeds may not be allowed to grow more than one foot high. Trash must be picked up and removed in a timely manner. Old appliances are a hazard and cannot be stored in your yard.

TREES/BUSHES: Cannot impede pedestrian traffic - please keep them trimmed.

OCCUPANCY: One family plus two(2) non-related persons or no more than three(3) non-related persons can live in a house.

There are no covenants in the Martin Acres neighborhood and diversity is welcome. We invite you to get to know your neighbors and join us at monthly gatherings.

Martin Acres volunteers will be working to qualify as many blocks as possible to participate in the RTD Eco-Pass program this fall. EcoPass is an unlimited bus pass for the RTD system, including all local and regional buses and the SkyRide. If you commute to work, or go to the airport and/or Denver even a few times a year, the pass generally pays for itself pretty quickly. Thanks to GO

Boulder, EcoPass holders also receive a variety of discounts with local retailers.

To qualify for the program, neighborhood blocks must raise a minimum contribution (last year was \$5000/block; this year is still to be determined by RTD), which is based on an average household contribution. GO Boulder of-

fers a subsidy to help blocks qualify. Last year, we had great success in getting several blocks qualified for the first time ever, and we're hoping to expand that success this year.

Each block interested in qualifying for EcoPasses will need a coordinator to serve as its block leader. Block leaders will receive logistical, moral, and other support from this year's troika of neighborhood coordinators. Serving as a block leader will require a commitment of approx. 4-6 hours spread over a few weeks, and it's a great way to meet your neighbors!


