

Radon Update :: submitted by Mark Stangl

Since obtaining the MANA radon detector, data has been obtained from about 25 Martin Acres residents. Of those reporting their readings (confidential) 9 had high readings, indicating that radon remediation is recommended. Of those not reporting readings (4) it is expected that they have high readings and want to remain private about their results. Based on these readings there appears to be higher concentrations of radon areas around Martin Park. We do not have enough data to know about other sections. Overall it appears that most Martin Acres residents should be concerned about measuring radon in their homes. In my home the radon level varies from about 7 ppm in dead winter to 2 in the summer. Yes, I am planning to install a system. The overall average should be 4 ppm or less.

The radon detector backlog is complete and it is available for neighborhood use: contact Mark Stangl 303-499-3163.

Safety Tip by Mark Stangl :: Many homes in Martin Acres are over 50 years old and have original forced air gas heaters in the crawl space and are not easy to service by the home owner. I have been doing Rental and Safety inspections for the Boulder Rental licensing program for 5 years and have found that some older 40+ year old gas furnaces can develop a Carbon Monoxide hazard if they are not burning well and have a defective heat exchanger. This is a small problem by percent, but can be very dangerous. CO can cause headaches at low levels, brain damage, and death at higher levels.

Homeowner CO detectors are recommended by the city and I suggest an annual service of your heater by an licensed HVAC contractor. In general, older systems often need cleaning, sensor replacement, and lubrication of motors. Newer systems need less maintenance, but still need filters changed regularly. If your heaters fan is slow to come on or fast to shut off you need service. All heaters should have filters changed as needed from once per month ranging to every 3 months during the heating season. There are a wide range of filter types all varying degrees of benefit. Although not common in Martin Acres, for gas hot water baseboard or electric heat, maintenance is simpler, but systems should be kept dust free and any gas burning appliance should be maintained by a licensed service company. I have also found several leaking gas meters and recommend that since meter reading is now automated by radio that homeowners report gas odors to Xcel Energy at 800-895-1999. Recently my own gas meter was replaced since it was not regulating pressure correctly and sometimes my burners on the stove would blow out due to high pressure.
