A Guide to Being Neighborly in Martin Acres

We are always striving to find ways to build on our community and have found that sharing ideals and goals with new folks helps us all to get along and makes for a better lifestyle for all.

PARTIES: Great, we like parties, too! Make sure your neighbors are aware of your plans. It is neighborly to invite them to call you if any concerns arise. It is easy to get a ticket for a loud party. Take your parties indoors and keep really quiet after 11 p.m.

NOISE: Unreasonable noise that disrupts another person in their home causes problems...pets, stereo/TV, parties/gatherings, cars, fireworks. All fireworks are illegal.

PETS: Unattended pets and barking are not only annoying but violate city ordinances. You must also clean up after your pets when they poop on other's property, and remember the city leash law.

PARKING AND DRIVING: Please park in front of your own house as a courtesy to your neighbors. Cars may be considered abandoned after 72 hours and may be ticketed, then towed. It is illegal to park on the sidewalk, in your yard, the wrong direction, and within 5 feet of any driveway. Cars parked halfway into driveways block the sidewalk, impeding pedestrian traffic is also a city violation and you'll get ticketed.

SNOW REMOVAL: All snow and ice must be cleared from the full width of a public sidewalk next to home property by noon on the day following a snowfall. The owner and occupant are jointly responsible for this removal (even when out-of-town).

WEEDS AND TRASH: Weeds may not be allowed to grow more than one foot high. Consult the city for xeriscaped yards info. Trash must be picked up and removed in a timely manner. Old appliances are a hazard and cannot be stored in your yard. Trash cans cannot be stored in the street except for trash day.

TREES/BUSHES: Cannot impede pedestrian traffic... please keep them trimmed off from over an in the full width of the sidewalk.

RESIDENTIAL OVER-OCCUPANCY: Only one family plus two(2) non-related persons or no more than three(3) non-related persons can live in a house. **All Rentals** are required to have a current **City Rental License.**
