# Martin Acres History by William Arndt

As a Boulder native who was always interested in architecture, here are my memories: BTW, I was born in 1947, so I vaguely remember the opening of the Turnpike in 1951. It was the start of big change in the City. I was also at the dedication of what's now the NIST Building by Pres. Eisenhower in 1953. My parents didn't move to MA until I was grown and out of the house, in 1972, but we had friends in MA long before that, like my neighbor Louise Adams who is an original owner (ca. 1955). In the 1950s, Sunday afternoons often consisted of visiting model homes all over town.

The first section of MA, to the northwest, was called Highland Park. MA 1 was when they started using brick, and extended to Martin Drive. I remember that for a long time Moorhead ended at Martin Drive. Martin Drive ended near Bear Creek (by the school). So all the cul-de-sacs east of Martin came later. This was also when split levels were introduced. The last to be built were the (still kind of strange) story-and-a-half salt boxes near Table Mesa

I have never considered Majestic Heights to be part of Martin Acres. For one thing, they always had their own school. I'm never sure what to call Dartmouth west of Broadway. Certainly not MA nor Table Mesa

It was not until the early '60s that South Boulder Road was renamed Table Mesa Drive. I think it was about '63 or '64 that an exit/ entrance to the Turnpike was added at Table Mesa. Before then, MA residents had to drive all the way back to Baseline to get on the Turnpike. You couldn't get off until Broomfield, then Federal. Broadway south of Baseline was Marshall Road. Hence "Base-Mar." Broadway has been widened many times. You used to be able to access Columbine, Bluebell, and Mariposa from Broad-

I could go on (the original IHOP, the trampoline pits at Base-Mar, the back entrances to the NIST property) but I tend to bore people.

Rats in Martin acres? This fall Rats have been seen crossing Broadway near Dartmouth Drive. We understand that a local homeowner who has been feeding birds for many years has attracted rats that have taken up residence in brush piles on the NIST property along Broadway. We consider this a public health hazard and the folks at NIST have been asked to address this problem. There is no action plan in place now.

At our Feb/08 meeting Xcel Energy sent Dennis Brachfeld, an Energy Star rater, talk about low-cost methods on saving heat and reducing your energy bills.

The Front Range of Colorado has had low natural gas prices because pipelines were not available to export natural gas to other parts of the country. Because of this building, codes not require wall insulation until about 1979. 45% of your of your energy bill is HVAC costs, 11% is hot water. The rest is electricity. Older refrigerators use a lot of power. Significant cost savings can be made converting all of your incandescent light bulb stew complex CFL or compact fluorescent light bulbs.

Drafty first story windows can significantly increase the draft in your home since heat rises. Recessed lighting in ceilings can be a cause for significant air leaks as heat rises up through them. The current building code require R38 in the attic but a R50 is recommended by building professionals.

Radiant reflective paint can be used on the inside walls of your house to keep energy and these paints can also act as a vapor barrier . Older furnaces draw cold air in through leaking windows in some homes. Homes with heaters in crawl spaces can draw their air from outside.

One of the most important things you can do with your crawlspace is to add a vapor barrier over the dirt floor. If you do so you can seal the venting off in your crawlspace if you have a vent to supply air to your basement heater. Sometimes this can be combined with a radon remediation system.

Radon Testing Equipment is available for MA residents use. Contact Mark Stangl. My experience is that radon varies quit a bit due to season and local barometric conditions. I recommend two tests. One in the not heating and one in the closed house heating season. Each test should last a week with at least 2 days in outside air or crawl space.


